Gifts of Love

People talk about love all the time. The Bible itself uses the word “love” over 500 times. Jesus identified love for God and love for others as the greatest of all commandments. What is this love the Bible talks about? Is it only a feeling, or is it something more?

God’s love

The Greek word *agape* describes the type of love God has for us. It is much more than a feeling, it’s an act of the will. It can be defined as “seeking the highest welfare – the best – for another.” It is the love Jesus commands us to have for others.

Agape love fills many needs

We know about human needs for food, water, clothing and shelter. But beyond these physical needs, we have internal needs for *significance and meaning* in our lives. We need *courage to press on*. We need *attention*, and we need *to be valued*. We also need *security, authenticity and structure*. We need *to be loved*, and we need *to work together*. We need *motivation to go on*. We need *to focus on higher things*, and we need *forgiveness & release*.

Filling needs in a relationship

We can help fill all of the needs mentioned above when we treat people according to the Biblical relationship principles we call the *12 Seeds*. Each seed is a useful gift that helps fill human needs. Since love involves helping to fill needs, each seed is a way to love others.

For example, we help fill a person’s need for *significance and meaning* when we give them Respect. We help fill their need for *attention* when we give them the gift of Listening. We help fill their need *to be valued* when we give them Appreciation.

A brief introduction and overview of each of the *12 Seeds* is found later in these pages.

The one great need in our Christian life is love, more love to God and to each other.

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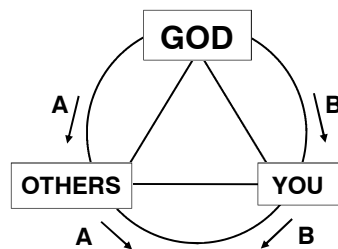
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A simple yet exciting truth

It is both amazing and humbling to realize that God provides for the fulfillment of our needs. Furthermore, He often uses other people to do so. Think about it. When you need *courage*, for example, doesn't it usually come to you through the encouraging words or actions of another person in your life? When you need *motivation to go on*, doesn't it usually come through a friend sharing words of hope with you, perhaps words from the Psalms?

What's even more exciting is that just as God uses other people to provide His gifts to us, He can also use us to share His gifts with others in our relationships. If someone has shared words of encouragement or hope with you, for example, you can in turn share such words with others. Your sharing of the gifts can be a real blessing to others.



The triangle above indicates relationships. The circle indicates God's gifts. The "A" arrows indicate the flow of God's gifts through others to help fill your needs. The "B" arrows indicate the flow of God's gifts through you to others.

The gifts come from God

How are we able to give all these gifts to others? We can give them because the Lord has given them to us. These gifts are some of the ways He loves us. Reread "Agape love fills many needs" on page 1 and think about how God provides for each of those needs in our lives, often using other people to do so.

As we receive His love it causes a change of heart in us. It brings His love, His *agape* love, into our hearts for others. It's a transformation from *self-centeredness* to **Christ-centeredness**, which then leads to *other-centeredness*. It comes with a supernatural ability, empowered by His Spirit, to share His gifts of love with others.

Are the gifts deserved?

No. They are special blessings or favors from the Supreme Giver. It's called grace. In fact, the word "grace" can be defined as "unmerited favor." We receive things we don't deserve; we give to others things they don't deserve. *So much for waiting for people to "earn" our respect or pardon, or any other gift, before we will share it with them.*

A few reasons to lovingly give:

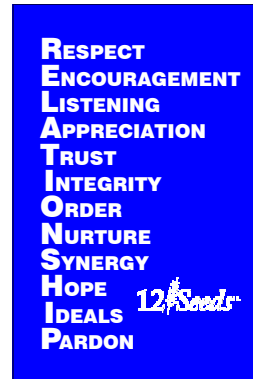
1. Loving others is a command of our Lord. We honor Him by obeying His command.

5. Human relationships grow.
6. Sharing God's transformational gifts changes lives, it changes relationships, it changes all aspects of life together.
7. Loving others is a witness to the world that we are followers of Christ.

Imagine a change from seeking what we can get out of relationships to seeking what we can give! Imagine what life could be like if we regularly gave respect, encouragement, listening, appreciation and the rest of the *12 Seeds* to others. Imagine the blessings for others, and for ourselves, as we live in a *community of givers in a world of takers!*

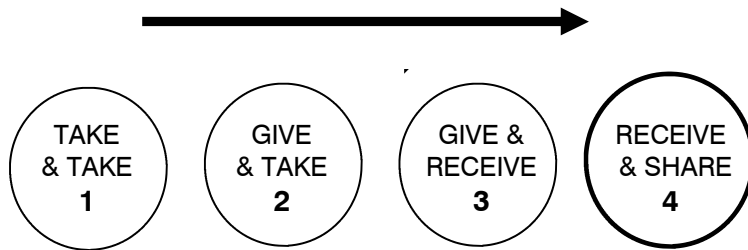

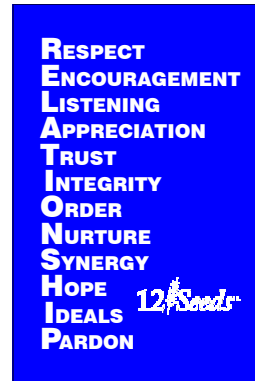
Sharing the gifts

God calls us to share the gifts He gives with others. Sharing God’s gifts of love changes our perspective and brings joy and fulfillment in life. This sharing is part of a profound transformation toward greater Christ-likeness. Empowered by His Spirit, we change from a “take & take” lifestyle to a life of “receive & share.”

Transformation toward greater Christ-likeness



1. **TAKE & TAKE** – This sphere is a simple picture of the self-centered life, the selfish world in which many people try to live. The focus is on taking more and more, by force or deceit if necessary.
2. **GIVE & TAKE** – Since #1 above usually does not work very well for long, many people live by “give & take,” the world’s system of compromise and “get along.” It can still be very self-centered since the motive for giving may be to get a “good feeling” for oneself, or to maintain a relationship in which one can continue to “get” or “take.”
3. **GIVE & RECEIVE** – This is a gentler version of “give & take” and acknowledges that one should “receive” rather than “take.” However, the motive for giving can still be quite selfish. Some altruism (concern for others) may be in this category.
4. **RECEIVE & SHARE** – This sphere acknowledges that we first receive gifts from God. Then, as His stewards, we share His gifts, His *agape* love, with others. It’s a powerful way to live that glorifies God, blesses people, fills needs, changes lives, enriches relationships, brings joy and provides fulfillment.



Sharing God’s gifts of love changes our perspective and brings joy and fulfillment in life.

A BRIEF INTRODUCTION TO THE 12 Seeds

The Bible has a number of practical principles for living out *agape* love. The *12 Seeds* are some of these principles. They are gifts God gives us as He relates to us. When they're received from God, planted in our hearts, and shared in our relationships, great harvests grow. Lives are changed.

The *12 Seeds* form an acrostic for the word RELATIONSHIP. Acrostics have long been used as memory devices to help remember important concepts. Psalms 9 and 10, for example, are known as Acrostic Psalms since each verse begins with the succeeding letter of the Hebrew alphabet.

5 ways to share the 12 Seeds

1. **Pray** for people and relationships. Thank God for His gifts. Ask for His help in sharing them.
2. **Meditate** on Scriptures that relate to each seed. Become more other-centered. Develop an attitude toward others characterized by the *12 Seeds*.
3. **Bless** others with good words (benedictions) of *Respect, Encouragement, Appreciation, Hope* and the other seeds.
4. **Serve** others. Treat them with *Nurture, Integrity, Pardon* and the rest of the seeds.
5. **Fellowship** with others. Practice the above ways together. Receive and share each seed. Reap a harvest of individual and group transformation.

RESPECT

REGARD, CONSIDERATION, HONOR

The word “respect” is from the Latin word *respectus*, meaning “to look at, regard.” To respect others is to have regard for their existence, ideas and opinions. Synonyms include attention, deference, esteem. Giving this seed helps fill the need for *significance and meaning*.

Honor one another above yourselves.

ENCOURAGEMENT

INSPIRING WITH COURAGE

Encouragement is inspiring (“breathing into”) another person with courage or confidence. It is to reassure them, spur them on, support their efforts to succeed. Synonyms include cheering, heartening, boosting. Giving this seed helps fill the need for *courage to press on*.

**Let us encourage one another – and all the more
as you see the Day approaching.**

LISTENING

SEEKING TO HEAR; HEEDING

Listening is “making a conscious effort to hear.” It is “paying attention to” another person. Listening is foundational to good communication and a vital part of any close relationship. Synonyms include attending, considering, hearkening, heeding. Giving the gift of listening helps fill the human need for *attention*.

**Everyone should be quick to listen,
slow to speak and slow to become angry.**

APPRECIATION

GRATEFUL RECOGNITION OF VALUE

Appreciation is grateful recognition of the value, quality or significance of a gift, deed or person. To say “Thank you” is a common way to express appreciation. Synonyms include thankfulness, acknowledgement, recognition. Giving this seed helps fill the need *to be valued*.

TRUST

CONFIDENCE IN ANOTHER

Trust is firm belief or confidence in the honesty, integrity or reliability of another person. Complete trust should only be in God, but a level of trust is important for any relationship. Synonyms include belief, faith, reliance. Giving this seed helps fill the need for *security*.

**Trust in the LORD with all your heart
and lean not on your own understanding.**

INTEGRITY

MORAL STRENGTH & WHOLENESS

Integrity is steadfast adherence to a moral or ethical code, and also the condition of being sound and complete. Synonyms include character, honor, virtue, nobility, ethics, honesty. Giving the gift of integrity helps fill the human need for *authenticity*.

**The integrity of the upright
guides them, but the unfaithful
are destroyed by their duplicity.**

– Proverbs 11:3

ORDER

STRUCTURE, PRIORITIES, GUIDELINES

Order includes observance of laws, guidelines and boundaries for conduct. It includes priorities (order of importance or precedence). Training in orderly behavior is called discipline; continuing in orderly behavior is called routine. Synonyms include harmony, pattern. Giving this seed helps fill the need for *structure*.

**Everything should be done in a
fitting and orderly way.**

NURTURE

CARE & FEEDING; LOVING SUPPORT

Nurture is caring for someone, doing things for the benefit of another. Closely related to “love,” nurture is love with hands and feet in action. It’s the way we can apply each of 12 Seeds to help meet needs. Synonyms include nourishment, assistance. Giving this seed helps fill the human need *to be loved*.

SYNERGY

COOPERATION, TEAMWORK

Synergy is the beautiful phenomenon that occurs when people working together in harmony perform and achieve far beyond what they would separately. Synonyms include accord, concert, conjunction. Giving this gift helps fill the human need *to work together*.

HOPE

POSITIVE EXPECTATIONS

Hope is a wish or desire accompanied by the confident expectation of its fulfillment. Synonyms include anticipation, aspiration, expectation, desire. Giving this seed helps fill the human need for *motivation to go on*.

**May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace
as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by
the power of the Holy Spirit.**

IDEALS

VALUES & MODELS OF EXCELLENCE

Ideals are the high standards and examples that are worthy of imitation and replication in a life of excellence. Synonyms include standards, principles, patterns. Giving this seed helps fill the need *to focus on higher things*.

**Whatever is true . . . noble . . . right . . .
pure . . . lovely . . . admirable –
if anything is excellent or praiseworthy –
think about such things.**

PARDON

FORGIVENESS & RELEASE

Pardon is forgiveness of an offense. It provides the offender with release from penalty; it provides the one granting pardon with release from bitterness. Synonyms include forgiveness, release, “letting go.” Giving pardon helps fill the need for *forgiveness and release*.
